Historical background

First introduced in 1976, the CJ-7 was the vehicle that introduced a new generation to the fun and adventure of open-top four wheeling. The CJ-7 could be considered the Jeep brand's first lifestyle vehicle. The CJ-7 featured a longer and wider body ensuring the drivers increased roominess. The wheelbase was almost 1 inch longer than the CJ-5. With the addition of special paint colors, radios and interior packages, the CJ-7 would capture the hearts of a younger generation that was looking to get out and experience the world. The CJ-7 was in production until 1986 when it was replaced by the Wrangler.
